She was one of the founders and the first president of the Massachusetts Women's Bar Association where she now serves on its Emeritus Board and that of the Women's Bar Foundation. Ms. Epstein has served by Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court appointment on the Board of Bar Overseers, the SJC's advisory committee on the Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Massachusetts IOLTA Committee.

Repeatedly selected to *Best Lawyers in America* for Family Law and to Massachusetts *Super Lawyers* for Family Law, Ms. Epstein received the Women's Bar Association's Lelia J. Robinson Award in 1999 in recognition of outstanding accomplishments and contributions to women in the legal profession. She received a Top Women of Law award from *Massachusetts Lawyers Weekly* in 2013 and was inducted into its

2015 Circle of Excellence. In 2015, she received the Massachusetts Bar Foundation's President's Award for her contributions to the foundation over the years.
